PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS RETURNING HOME **IN CONJUNCTION WITH SEMESTER HOLIDAYS 2020/2021**

We are pleased to inform that following the latest notification from the Government through the Media Statement of the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) entitled Pergerakan Pelajar Institusi Pengajian Tinggi Pulang Sempena Cuti Semester 2020/2021, dated 9 July 2021, the University has agreed to improve the procedures for in / out campus movement of students, which was previously published through Student Circular No. 12/2021 dated 30 June 2021, "Student Movement Procedures Leave/Enter UTM Johor Bahru Campus and UTM Kuala Lumpur Campus Following the Extension of the Full Movement Control Order (MCO 3.0)".

- 2.0 Accordingly, the University through the University Management Committee Meeting (JPU) dated 14 July 2021 has agreed to implement the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for the movement of UTM students returning home which will be effective from 12 July 2021. Through this SOP, students currently staying on UTM campus are allowed to return home either by using own vehicle or transportation provided by the University. The trip is a one way trip only.
- 3.0 The University has also set a movement control mechanism for students returning home which will be implemented in phases. However, the movement of students to any Enhanced Movement Control Order (PKPD) area is postponed until the EMCO of the area is lifted. Student categories and general SOP are as in Table 1 and Appendix 1.

Please note, any violation of these instructions may be subject to disciplinary action by the University.

FOR STUDENTS STAYING ON CAMPUS

NO	SUBJECT	PERMISSION
1.	Students staying on campus	 Parents/guardians/next-of-kins are not allowed to travel interstate/district to fetch their child/dependent on campus. Student movement to the PKPD areas (including students from UTM KL) is postponed until the PKPD is lifted. Modes of transportation are restricted to transportation provided by the University and own vehicles. Flight services can be given permission if there is a need. Permission letter to return home will be issued to students through UTMSmart. Students do not need to obtain police approval for interstate/district travel.
2.	Students staying within a 10km radius from campus	 Parents/guardians/next-of-kins are not allowed to travel interstate/district to fetch their child/dependent on campus Mode of transportion is restricted to own vehicles only. Permission letter to return home will be issued to students through UTMSmart. Students do not need to obtain police approval for interstate/district travel. For students in UTM Kuala Lumpur, movement in/out of PKPD areas is postponed until the PKPD is lifted.
3.	Students of Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan	 Students are required to undergo a swab test at the nearest District Health Center (PKD) (Sarawak - 3 days before travelling; Sabah - 5 days before travelling) The cost of the swab test is borne by the government All students are required to undergo a 14-day quarantine at a place designated by the state government. The cost of quarantine is funded by the respective state government. Transportation from the campus to the airport will be provided by the University.
4.	Students from The State of Perlis	Students returning to Perlis are required to undergo quarantine upon arrival at the destination. The cost of quarantine is borne by the students.
5.	International Students	 All movement to return to the country of origin are based on the latest SOP released by the Malaysia National Security Council (NSC). Matters concerning travelling arrangements and documentations are coordinated by the UTM International office (UTMi).
